

OCTOBER 2, 2007

The Harriman City council met in regular session October, 2, 2007 at 7:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Harriman Municipal/Utility Building. The Honorable Chris Mason, Mayor was present and presiding. Mayor called meeting to order. Roll call of Council was as follows:

Mayor Mason asked for a motion to approve the minutes from September 11, 2007. Councilmember Tedder made the motion and Councilmember Powers seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Mason asked for a motion to pay the salaries. Councilmember Mee made the motion and was seconded by Councilmember Wright. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

DELEGATIONS

Mayor Mason asked the Public if anyone would like to approach Council. Noone approached Council.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Mason asked Councilmember Mee if he had any old business. Councilmember Mee advised no.

Mayor Mason asked Councilmember Tedder if he had any old business. Councilmember Tedder advised no

Mayor Mason asked Councilmember Wright if he had any old business. Councilmember Wright advised no

Mayor Mason asked Councilmember Sampson if he had any old business. Councilmember Sampson advised that he has been working on flagging the street lights that are in need of repair.

Councilmember Sampson also asked that the Recreation and Parks Committee be allowed to start researching possible sites for a boat ramp in Harriman. Council unanimously agreed.

Mayor Mason asked Councilmember Powers if he had any old business. Councilmember Powers advised no

Mayor Mason advised that the Emory Golf and Country Club has made the golf employees seasonal. This decision was approved by the Golf Board.

Mayor Mason advised that TDOT will be having a meeting Tuesday, October 16th at Bowers Elementary School at 6PM. He would like Council to attend.

Mayor Mason advised that the City is on deadline with the decision regarding construction on Margrave Bridge. After much discussion, Mayor Mason asked for a motion. Councilmember Tedder made a motion to spend \$140,000.00 to begin the Margrave Bridge Project. Councilmember Wright seconded the motion. Councilmember's Mee, Tedder, Wright and Powers all voted, "yes". Councilmember Sampson voted, "no". The motion passed with a majority "yes" vote.

Mayor Mason advised that Terry Nickels has been in contact with Architects and Engineers to look through the Temperance building and advise on repairs that are needed to the building.

AGENDA

Mayor Mason asked for a motion to approve Tracey Bolden becoming a Notary. Cost to the city for an on-line class is \$169.00. Councilmember Wright made the motion and Councilmember Tedder seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Mason asked for a motion to approve Donna Demyanovich to the H.E.A.T. Committee. Councilmember Powers made the motion and Councilmember Wright seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Mason asked for a motion to approve Scott Mason, Chris Ahler, and Darryl Cole to the Hooray for Harriman. Councilmember Tedder made the motion and Councilmember Mee seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Mason advised of the condition of the existing phone system for the Police Station. He asked for a motion to accept bids on replacing the Police Station's phone system. The motion was made by Councilmember Wright and was seconded Councilmember Sampson. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".


Further Business
